**[May 20, 2022]** — (Chilmark, Massachusetts) Summer 2022 marks a momentous occasion at The Yard — the cherished dance organization's 50th summer season! The Yard is thrilled to celebrate with the return of in-person movement classes, *Kids Do Dance*, artist workshops, and a cohort of topflight artists-in-residence.

This summer, The Yard continues its practice of presenting innovative and invigorating works that excite, inspire, and encourage growth. Some artists will share completed works, while others invite the audience into the middle of their creative process. All are engaging in unique ways with the pressing social and cultural issues of the time. Events will be held at The Yard's Chilmark campus and at locations across Martha's Vineyard.

Dedicated to spreading knowledge and positively impacting the Island community through dance and movement, The Yard has focused on reinvigorating its in-person programming since the initial COVID-19 shutdown of 2020. The 2022 summer calendar has inclusive movement classes and varied engagement programs. Whether a long time dancer or a toddler just finding their balance, there is something for everyone.

Velez-Jackson currently survives multiple myeloma cancer. She is committed to the healing and transformative potential of art and integrated body/mind practice, as well as advocating for accessibility in the arts.

While in residence at The Yard, LVJ Performance Co. will share a late-stage-in-progress excerpt of their current work, *Protecting Complexity with the Star Pû Method.* With healing as a core facet through movement, breath, communal connection, and vocal sound, LVJ asks whether the performance encounter provides a space that makes healing actually possible.

Lucky Plush Productions is an ensemble dance-theater company based in Chicago, led by founder and Artistic Director Julia Rhoads. The company is committed to provoking and supporting an immediacy of presence—a palpable live-ness—shared by performers in real-time with audiences. A unique hybrid of high-level dance and theater, Lucky Plush's work is recognized for its layered choreography, nuanced dialogue, surprising humor, and socially relevant content.

While in residence at The Yard, Lucky Plush Productions will present *Rink Life*. Lucky Plush brings its highly integrated approach to dance-theater into a communal space that nods to the visual aesthetics and social dynamics of 1970s roller rink culture. *Rink Life*'s staging and choreography are built from the rink's spatial rules and social codes, and its script-turned-libretto—created from passing conversations, distant

whispers, pop-song earworms, and found scripts—is entirely spoken and sung live. As the ensemble sings full-throatedly to score their experiences, they demonstrate through effort, risk, beauty, and failure that they—and we—are utterly dependent on one another.

Urban Bush Women (UBW), founded in 1984 by choreographer Jawole Willa Jo Zollar, is a Brooklyn-based performance ensemble and dance company under the artistic direction of Chanon Judson and Samantha Speis. UBW seeks to bring the untold and under-told histories and stories to light through dance. They do this from a woman-centered perspective and as members of the African Diaspora community in order to create a more equitable balance of power in the dance world and beyond.

Over the course of two years, Urban Bush Women is engaging with The Yard to develop a site-specific version of their work, *Haint Blu*, on Martha's Vineyard. This year their residency will focus on community engagement. *Haint Blu* is an ensemble dance-theater work steeped in memory and magic. Known as the color that Southern families paint their front porches to ward off bad spirits, *Haint Blu* uses performance as a center and source of healing, taking us through movement into stillness and rest. It is an embodied look into familial lines and the movements, histories, and stories of our elders and ancestors. It reflects on what has been lost across generations and what can be recovered. *Haint Blu* takes us to the magical place where spirits share their legacies, journey onward, and leave the thick residue of their knowing behind. *Haint Blu* is inspired by *SCAT!*, Urban Bush Women's musical theater work in development.

T.W.I.S.T is performed by five female athletes of the heart.

Along with *T.W.I.S.T*, Adele Myers and Dancers will host TWISTalks — a creative research and community engagement element of T.W.I.S.T. TWISTalks are gatherings for women to share, listen, laugh, and twist against the disempowering ways we move through the world in our daily choreographies.

Founded by Ronald K. Brown in 1985 and based in Brooklyn, New York, EVIDENCE, A Dance Company, focuses on the seamless integration of traditional African dance with contemporary choreography and spoken word. Through their work, EVIDENCE provides a unique view of human struggles, tragedies, and triumphs. Brown uses movement as a way to reinforce the importance of community in African American culture and to acquaint audiences with the beauty of traditional African forms and rhythms. He is an advocate for the growth of the African American dance community and is instrumental in encouraging young dancers to choreograph and to develop careers in dance.

While in residence at The Yard, EVIDENCE will present *The Equality of Night and Day (TEND)* at the Performing Arts Center. *TEND* is a new work by Brown examining the concepts of balance, equity, and fairness in light of the conflicting present-day issues that young people, women, and people of color now face. In a world where exploitation, gentrification, racism, and xenophobia are on the rise, the current shift in public discourse anchors the new piece. TEND is realizing that there is a need for mercy in a bigger way than you thought. The new work will be presented alongside *Ebony Magazine: To A Village* and *UPside Down* from Brown's remarkable repertoire.

Danza Orgánica & Aquinnah Wampanoag Tribal Members

In Residence, July 25 - August 2, 2022 Performances Fall 2022 | TBA Danza Orgánica is a dance theater company that creates anti-racist, anti-patriarchal, and decolonizing work. Through high-quality performance, education (Dance for Social JusticeTM), and the annual festival We Create, they work with-and-for communities interested in embodying a liberated future. They honor the right to express the BIPOC experience and leave a legacy that sheds light upon an untold side of history.

Danza Orgánica first connected with members of the Aquinnah Wampanoag Tribe during their 2018 residency at The Yard. Since then, the two groups have been collaborating to create **âs nupumukâunean** (We Still Dance), which highlights traditional and contemporary stories of the Aquinnah Wampanoag People through dance, song, installation, and storytelling. They continue their work this summer with performances slated for this fall — a culmination of four years of creative, collaborative development.

Grounded in African diasporic perspectives, Brownbody's mission is to build artistic experiences that disrupt biased narratives and prompt audiences to engage as active participants in the journey. Brownbody accomplishes this through a blend of modern dance, theater, social justice, and figure skating.

While in residence at The Yard, BrownBody will present *Tracing Sacred Steps*, which blends modern dance, figure skating, and Ring Shout. In her essay, "Hoodoo Religion and American Dance Traditions: Rethinking the Ring Shout", Katrina Hazzard states: "It was from the African sacred circle, that the first truly African American dance was born: the 'Ring Shout."

*Tracing Sacred Steps* engages elements of Ring Shout to illustrate how it continues to serve as a pathway to healing within so many Black spaces. It illustrates how this practice continues to be relevant, pays homage to these important cultural rituals, and its practitioners: forcibly displaced Africans that found a way, amidst grave adversity, to work towards restoration and wholeness. *Tracing Sacred Steps* features an all-Black cast of four professional skating artists and actor/vocalist Thomasina Petrus.
